Rev. H Ellis Rogers BA



Following Rev. John Lloyd-Williams as minister at St Johns, was Rev Ellis Rogers. He came to us from a small Welsh chapel in Merthyr-Capel Soar. He was a

dedicated minister and was here from 1927 to 1946, nearly 20 years. He buried my grandparents, married my husband and I, christened three of my children, and brought me into membership.

He was married, but had no children. His mother, a dear old lady, lived with him and his wife. Mrs Rogers Junior was a gentle lady, who supported her husband in everything. They lived in our Manse, a lovely house next to our church, and we should never have sold it!! Although Rev Rogers was a sincere and

quiet man, he was very much loved here in the chapel and popular in Tenby. He used to adjudicate the written work every year in the Greenhill Grammar School Eisteddfod on March 1st. He retired after his mother died in 1964, and went to live in Ty Draw Road, Cardiff, opposite Roath Park. Written by Eluned Brown.
