### 2020 is a Leap Year

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### Recipe of the month: Tourain, a Tomato Soup.

This tomato soup is from southern France. In winter, when vitality and vitamins, to say nothing of sunshine, seem conspicuously lacking, it brings a promise of warmer days ahead.

3/4 pint canned tomato juice, 1 onion, 1/2 pint water, ½-1oz long rice, or spaghetti broken small, ½ oz oil or butter, seasoning. Slice the onion and soften it in the fat. Mix tomato juice and water, and sieve the onion into the liquid. Bring to the boil, season, especially with enough pepper, throw in the rice and cook fairly quickly 12 -15 minutes until rice is done.
