Idership is a central ministry within the life of the church. Elders are feel called by God to take a leading role from within the membership and who those people whose gifts of oversight and leadership have been recognised within the life of the church.

I Iders share with the minister in the pastoral oversight and leadership of the local church. To welfare of the Church. It is their duty to arrange for the proper maintenance of church buildings, - each is normally entrusted a group of members. In the elders' meeting they take counsel together for the whole congregation. They are responsible for making provision for Christian worship and education, for maintaining proper standards of membership, and for promoting witness and service to the community, mission at home and abroad, and the peace, unity and and to ensure the oversight of church finances. Some elders represent and by virtue of their membership of these councils the local church in the wider councils of the Church, represent the whole Church to the local church."

Take a look at the following Bible passages


1Timothy 5:17-20; Titus 1:5-9; James 5:14-15; 1Peter 5:1-5

Furthermore, elders are accountable to the members. They are Watching over the flock, they are eager to serve. Service is a key word, Elders are warned not to lord it to be trustworthy with the Gospel and sound in their doctrine.

As with all service in the church we are not , for example, a fully formed elder at ordination, but we grow and learn and develop into the role, in life-long learning
